#### **BLOCK OF THE MONTH PROGRAM**

#### Women & Children's Horizons will be the focus for the block of the month blocks.

As a group effort let us "warm up their shelter" with our combined talents.

Please <u>bring any completed</u> Blocks to the December meeting. All past block of the month patterns are on the web site. We hope to be able to get enough blocks back from the guild members to assemble a twin size quilt. 12 blocks are needed to make a top *with* borders and sashing. 30 blocks for a twin size, *without* borders and sashing reduces the cost per top. Extra blocks will be assembled into wall hangings, table toppers and or lap quilts.

The quilts will be given to the Kenosha Women's & Children's Horizons emergency shelter. They have 30 twin size beds and can house 10-15 adult women and 15-20 baby to teens in their shelter. We hope to help give them a warm homey place to stay.


\*\*\*\***So** remember to do your block of the month block and return it to the Southport Guild meetings each month.

#### 2017-2018 Quilt Challenge




The challenge this year is 'quilting by numbers'. As quilters, we use numbers every time we quilt. Either it's to figure out how much fabric we need, or what size to cut our strips and squares. This year's challenge begins when you roll the dice. You will get a number between 1 and 6. That will drive your quilt design. You can do either applique, or make a pieced square (or 2 or 4, or whatever number you get). If you do applique, your quilt can have background items as long as the main applique motif matches the number you rolled. For example, if you roll a 3 you could do 3 flowers in a vase, with a background of a table and window. If you rolled a 4, you could do the 4 main characters of the wizard of OZ, with a background of the yellow brick road, etc. If you wanted to do a pieced quilt and rolled a 5, you could do a medallion in the middle with 4 quilt squares comprising the border. Your opportunities for creativity are boundless! The entire quilt must be 20 x 20 inches (including binding) and you must use the small piece of fabric we provide in your quilt. There is a \$3 fee and as usual the quilts must be done by the end of February for entry into the March Quilt show.
