HOSTING DUTIES

Coordinator for 2019-2020 is Christy Burmeister 262-694-1007

- 1. Provide a variety of treats by 6:15pm the night of our meetings. Remember to provide a variety (sweets, nuts, fruit, cheeses, vegetables etc.). Some members cannot eat sweets.
- 2. Set up counter with treats and beverages.
- 3. Guild will provide coffee, tea bags and hot water for tea. If other beverages are wanted, the hostesses can choose to provide other items: juice, soda, cider, iced tea. Christy will provide the ice and water.
- 4. A seasonal runner or decoration always adds a little festivity.
- 5. The coordinator will make sure that enough plates, napkins, plastic ware, and hot/cold cups are available. If the hostesses want a seasonal theme, please make arrangements among yourselves to furnish the necessary items.


